

Arthroscopy at VSS



VSS has been performing arthroscopy for many years with excellent outcomes.

Arthroscopy is where we look inside the joint with a small camera. It is a minimally invasive procedure and therefore pets can recover from the surgery very quickly.

Common arthroscopic procedures are;

- in conjunction with cruciate ligament stabilisation surgery, to examine the joint and treat any damage to the meniscus cartilage (C-shaped cartilages inside the knee joint).
- to diagnose and help treat osteochondritis dissecans (OCD). Arthroscopy can be used to remove loose cartilage or bone fragments from the joint and debride underlying bone,

which can help relieve pain and improve joint function.

 to remove elbow coronoid fragments associated with elbow dysplasia.

Common joints arthroscopically explored are the stifle (knee), shoulder and elbow.

Because arthroscopy is less invasive than traditional open surgery, it can mean less pain, less scarring, and a faster recovery time for dogs.
